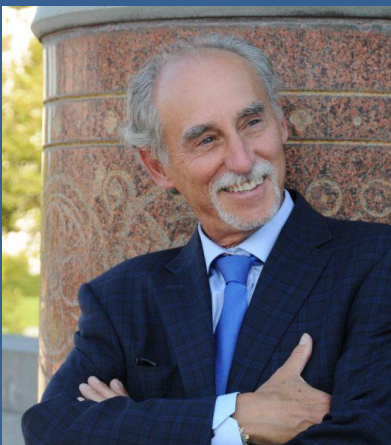


**Brian Bell**
